

# Reoccupation Guidance for Open Space

Following the easing of lockdown restrictions NHSPS has produced a guide to safely reoccupying its buildings and the process for service users to follow. See guide here.

To allow the safe return of all services, patients, contractors, and visitors NHSPS are conducting site risk assessments for all NHSPS demised and common areas. Areas included are waiting rooms, reception areas, shared toilets, sessional and NHS Open Space rooms. See Risk Assessment checklist here.

Upon completion each site will be rated High, Medium or Low with actions required to mitigate risks; once all actions have been completed and the site is rated as Low *(all practical measures taken to manage transmission risk)* it will be certified as ready for reoccupation. See certificate here.

## Key Factors for Open Space

#### Bins

All non-clinical rooms must now have a clinical waste bin to ensure PPE can be discarded and disposed of correctly

PPE classified as clinical waste = face masks, gloves, aprons, wipes

FM's to request approval & cost code from OS to procure new bins for site

## Cleaning

Cleaning frequencies will continue as per schedule. Additional and/or deep cleans are upon request via the helpdesk

Cleaning will be undertaken using an appropriate cleaner and disinfectant solution

Frequent touchpoints such as door handles, door plates, waiting rooms will receive more focus

#### Consumables

OS provide disposable gloves, apron, couch roll, soap, paper towels, sanitiser as standard

OS will not be providing face masks, this is the responsibility of the services using the rooms.

FM's will order consumables required for site as per process.

## Handwashing

Soap and paper towels must be available in rooms with handwashing facilities

Non-clinical rooms must provide hand sanitiser or clinical wipes for use where no handwashing facilities are available

Sanitiser dispensers will be added to site entrances and waiting areas for staff & patients to use.

### **Room Types**

No change to room types or their usage at present

The use of A/C is still being discussed so potential impact to use of Treatment Rooms and Minor Ops Suites

Group/meeting/counselling room occupancy should be reviewed

## Signage

Black & Yellow signage will be provided for all locations to prevent confusion with other emergency signage

Alert Signage at entrances, floor signage denoting distance for reception safety and one-way sytems in the centre

"Do not sit here" signs and barrier tape to be used to cordon off seating in the waiting rooms to maintain distance

Maximum occupancy room stickers will be added to doors for group/meeting rooms

## **Social Distancing**

Perspex protective screens to be fitted to reception desks currently without a shield

One-way systems for car parking, entrances, site flow as possible - no entry/one way signage to support

One person on a stairwell at one time, lift occupancy based on size - stickers denote placing
