Strategic placement of departments, services or rooms next to each other to improve flow and efficiency.

An important part of healthcare planning which brings in diverse perspectives, including clinical expertise, lived experience and policy insight.

A structured list of all the rooms and spaces required for a healthcare facility.

What the patient sees, feels, and interacts with at each stage of care.
